"As the agent of Jesus, you changed my life!" says a listener to TWR from East Africa. But things were very different 24 years ago.

In 1989, Wakshuma was a young man living in a communist-governed country. "Life was very difficult for me," he says. "My mother was very poor and couldn't care for me. My father had died."


In this setting he found comfort and encouragement from TWR broadcasts and the letters received from a TWR missionary in the listener response department. "The letters changed the course of my life. The letters encouraged me to follow Jesus", Wakshuma says as he found comfort reading the Bible and study materials sent by TWR.

In those days, the communist directive of his country dictated that people could not be Christian. Churches were blocked off and people forbidden to attend. Wakshuma recalls the day of his most difficult persecution. "I was very young. They forced me to walk, on my knees, over rough gravel. My knees were cut and bleeding and I was in tears. But I went home and listened to the TWR programs and was encouraged."

Today, Wakshuma is electronic media division director for the Ethiopian Evangelical Church's communication service – a partner of TWR – which produces 14 TWR series in several languages!

TWR touches men and women, youth and children across Africa daily, over FM, AM or shortwave radio, through cell phones and the Web. The number of text messages, phone calls and listener visits is as varied as the peoples of Africa. But each person plays a vital role in God's plan and purpose.
