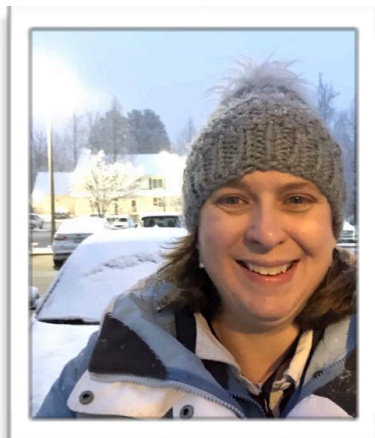

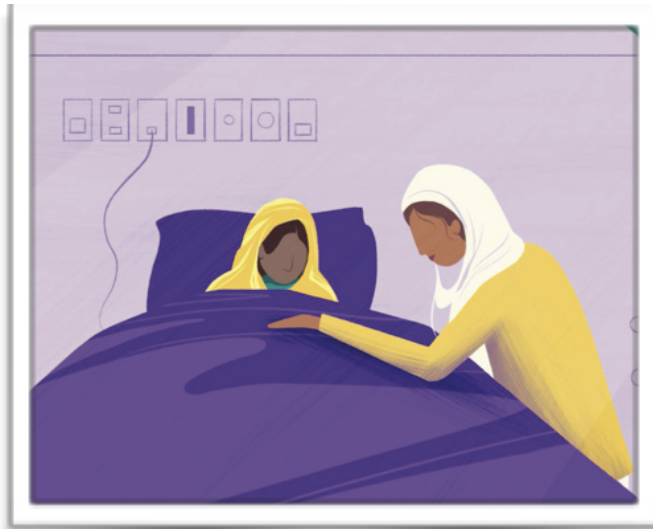
MOTION ON THE MOVE

Back in Cary, North Carolina, Andrew's team continues work with church planters to expand the OneStory animation series into new languages. The first two languages continue to

reach tens of thousands. One Middle East viewer said, "I can't believe these videos answered all my questions."

A church planter shared how the series helped disciple a young woman who is a new believer. "She came across the videos and stole Wi-Fi from her neighbor in order to watch them," he said. "She loved them."

We're also adding new video series for discipleship and training projects. In partnership with Arab World Media on PALM (Preparing Arab World Leaders for Ministry) brand new animations will accompany their discipleship curriculum, *Progressing Together*.

This curriculum has been used for more than 40 years, and is an excellent resource for believers coming from a Muslim background.

In another partnership with Media to Movements, a ministry that trains on media strategy, we're making videos to equip church planters that connect with people spiritually seeking online. Days ago, we postponed travel for this series. We appreciate your prayers as we work around delayed schedules.

ENGLISH ESL ANIMATED SERIES

Even before virus quarantining began to be such a big thing the first weekend in March, testing an English version of the OneStory series for international college students was called off for lack of student participation.
